Dear Mom

They have wrote [sic] about 3 or 4 letters to me and I still haven't wrote [sic] to them yet. In the letter I got yesterday from them they ask if I was still here on the camp I gess [sic] they thought I got shipped I'll have to try writing to them as soon as I can find time I got cookies you sent to me and they was [sic] pretty good. you said dad was picking corn for the hogs. He will have to get his corn picked pretty soon won't he. I always hated to grease that dam [sic] corn picker. how I wouldn't mind it now if I could come home and pick corn next year. I'll be home if I don't inlist [sic] again I suppose

you and dad have all you can handle with carrots [illegible] and [illegible] Well mom gess [sic] my boyfriend is going to get his picture out tonight if he does I will send you a picture of him. He is a nice looking boy. That was a very nice picture of her two [sic]. I went down to the park with my boyfriends we took pictures there went to the show I had a nice time with them two. If he gets the pictures out I'll try and get some off a [sic] him and send them two [sic] you. Boy when I look at those pictures I wished I was back home. Well I soon have to go to the show with my buddy.

Your [sic] doing pretty good if you can read his writing, I think. We took some pictures down at the park Sunday. So if they are any good I'll get some of them and send home. Did you find a washing machine Saturday, I really think its a good thing that you have decided to get one. But you better not try to take in any washing to do, just your own. I see a lot [sic] of them out here in the store, May Tags [sic] and all kinds. So Ruth would like to rent Uncle Clates place Lyle probably could rent some more land out there by it couldn't he. Has Gilbert's ever decide [sic] what he was going to do yet. I'd like to see you set some good neighbors in there when Geo. Scott lives. I wouldn't want that Earl Enabit to live there either. That would be a nice place for dad to buy wouldn't it.
