A GUIDE TO EVENTS AT THE MUSEUM DISTRICT

The Grout Museum District is taking extra measures to maintain the safety of our staff as well as our guests. We are diligently following state and local guidelines for preventative action regarding the possible transmission of COVID-19. We want everyone to be involved in the responsibility we have to our ourselves and our neighbors.

WHAT WE IMPLEMENTED DURING THE CLOSURE

- Rotating work schedules to limit physical interaction
- Routinely disinfected all surfaces in each building
- Sanitizing stations placed throughout the buildings
- Masks required in the Grout Museum District at all times
- Sneeze guards installed at the front desk

STEPS FOR PREVENTATIVE ACTION MOVING FORWARD

- Masks required in the Grout Museum District; available at the front desk for \$1
- All buildings to observe social distancing; markers in place to help
- Signage in all buildings to help remind guests of the necessary steps to stay vigilant
- All food or drink to be served by specified service members; keeping all food/drink separate from event room; boxed, bottled or canned items recommended
- All food service members required to wear mask and gloves
- Complete sanitization of venue after events conclude
- Tables to be set up 6 ft apart with no more than 10 per table
- We would ask that you remain at your table if you can help it

HOW YOU CAN HELP BE RESPONSIBLE

- Talk with your guests to ensure anyone with a vulnerability takes appropriate precautions or stays home
- Stay home if you are sick or not feeling well
- Bring tissue to cover any coughs or sneezes that may arise; throw tissue away
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after using the restroom; before eating; and after blowing your nose or coughing
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth with unwashed hands
- Avoid handshaking and hugging
- Be cognizant of the space between yourself and others
