ECLECTIC COLLECTIONS ON DISPLAY THROUGH JUNE 30, 2022

The Museum has displayed thousands of objects in exhibits over the years, but there are many more pieces in storage that have never been seen by the public. Have you wondered what other pieces might be preserved behind the scenes? Or maybe you want to know how the Museum chooses items to become part of the permanent collection? How does the Museum organize the objects in the collection? The answers to these questions and more are in this unique exhibit.



RECENT ACQUISITIONS CASE

Since the death of George Floyd on May 25, 2020 fifteen to twenty-six million Americans have participated in protests, marches, and demonstrations; the largest single protest movement in American history. Locally, an estimated 1,500 residents of Waterloo and Cedar Falls participated in about 12 protests since the first demonstration in Lincoln Park, Waterloo on May 29, 2020.

The Museum began an initiative in June 2020 to document the movement through the collection of stories, images, and objects. To date, the Museum has collected 61 protest-related objects from 13 donors and has collected almost 150 images from those same donors or from staff members.

In order to quickly reciprocate the generosity of the donors and to thank the community for its willing participation, the Museum has dedicated an extended *Recent Acquisitions* exhibit to telling the local story of the protests of 2020. Donors helped develop and plan the exhibit and wrote content to accompany their own pieces in the cases.

OVER LAND & SEA: IOWANS IN THE PACIFIC IN WWII NOW - DECEMBER 31, 2022 GROUT MUSEUM OF HISTORY & SCIENCE

December 7, 1941, "a day which will live in infamy," changed everything the United States believed about its security in the Pacific, resulting in the US and Japan becoming engulfed in years of gruesome fighting.

Over 285,000 US soldiers fought in the Pacific and thousands of them were lowans. Through their stories came the beauty and horror of the Pacific Theater and what it took to win the war against Japan.

Dear Grout Museum Friends,

As most of you know, the refurbished *Norris Corson Family Planetarium* opened to the public in December. It has been a resounding success, far beyond expectations. The programs offered are outstanding and endlessly fascinating. The result has been a significant increase in interest in the museum and in additional memberships. The planetarium is one of only three in the state offering scheduled programming.

As the museum prepared for the planetarium opening, it became apparent that an ongoing problem was about to become even worse. When the Sullivan Brothers Iowa Veterans addition to the museum opened in 2008, the main entrance was moved from adjacent to the parking lot to Park Avenue. For a variety of reasons, this has never been a successful change. Many who come to the museum continue to park in the parking lot and enter the museum by pressing the buzzer to have the door opened by a staff person. Since the planetarium is near that entrance, traffic through that door has increased.

Consequently, an interior reconstruction project has become an urgent necessity. Plans are for the main entrance to be relocated adjacent to the parking lot. This requires moving the gift shop up to the area across from the planetarium that now houses offices. The offices will be moved to the back of the conference room. Moving the gift shop allows for the event center to be opened up and to accommodate larger groups which improves the rental opportunities. In addition, the parking lot is in serious need of resurfacing.

In order to accomplish these much-needed changes, a new fundraising effort, *Opening New Doors*, is underway. Volunteers and staff are working hard to meet the challenge. Several generous donations have spurred the effort to raise the funds to keep this tremendous community asset moving forward and now we're asking for the community's support.
