WELCOME

Prepare for an exciting journey experiencing living history, learning about simple machines, getting up close and personal with reptiles or discussing the rich history of immigration and migration in the area. Everything you need to plan a field trip to the Grout Museum District is inside, including pricing, how to make a reservation and a list of programs and demonstrations. *All programs align with Iowa Core guidelines.*



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WHAT DOES IT COST?

Children (Pre-school - Twelfth Grade)

- \$3.00 per child per program
- Preschool First Grade programs: 30 Minutes
- Second Twelfth Grade programs: 45 minutes

Choose at least one program from each site to receive a 25% discount!

- \$9.00 per child
- 9:30am 2:00pm
- Choose 4 different programs
- Includes a lunch break

Teacher/Chaperone

One adult is **REQUIRED** for every 8 children and will be admitted free. All bus drivers will also receive free admission. Additional adults will be charged the child rate depending upon program(s) selected.

WHAT DO I NEED TO KNOW?

- Minimum group of 15 kids required
- One adult required for every 8 children
- Reservation **MUST** be made at least two weeks prior to tour
- Reservations are booked on a first-come, first-served basis
- Dates cannot be "held"
- Family memberships are **NOT** allowed in place of student cost
- Adults/chaperones **ARE** allowed to use their membership
- Tours at the Grout Museum, and Iowa Veterans Museum are available Tuesday-Friday
- Tours at the Imaginarium and Russell House are available Wednesday-Friday

HOW TO MAKE A RESERVATION

Please have the following information ready:

- Museum programs to be reserved
- Date and time of arrival (have alternate dates)
- Name of school and teacher in charge
- Complete mailing address and telephone number of school
- Grade level and number of students, teachers and chaperones
- Special needs (disabilities, hearing/sight impaired)

PRIOR TO YOUR TRIP

- You will receive a confirmation packet detailing costs, maps and parking directions
- Make a copy of the map and parking instructions for the bus driver. Bring the confirmation sheet to front desk upon arrival
- If paying by check have **ONE CHECK** for the entire amount. Teacher will be reimbursed for any absences. We also accept Visa, Mastercard, & Discover
- Make check payable to Grout Museum District
- Confirmation form designates the building where the tour starts
- Designate a chaperone for each group of 8 children. That chaperone must stay with those 8 children at all times
- Name tags for each child and adult are greatly appreciated

UPON ARRIVAL

- Programs begin promptly as scheduled, so please be on time
- If extra time is needed before the program please arrive early
- Upon arrival museum staff will greet the group
- One teacher must know the exact number of children and adults attending and have payment and confirmation form ready

GROUT MUSEUM OF HISTORY & SCIENCE

PIONEER HALL

Grades Pre-5

An 1846 cabin, 1850s general store, tool shed, carpenters shop, and blacksmith shop help students visualize life for Iowa's pioneers.

NATIVE AMERICANS Grades Pre-5

Explore the culture of Native Americans, by: discussing the migration of Native Americans in Iowa, learning ways they communicated, viewing artifacts and pictures from local tribes, and learn and perform Native American powwow dances.

SCAVENGER HUNT Grades 2-6

Teachers and chaperones help students explore the Grout/SBIVM and uncover facts about the history and growth of the Cedar Valley, and Iowa's role in the military.

ENGINE OF THE HEARTLAND Grades 4 & up

Students will see the evolution of Waterloo from a small county-seat town into a Midwest industrial center through a series of displays and models of local industries such as John Deere, Rath Packing and the Illinois Central Railroad Roundhouse. Progression of safety in the workplace is also discussed.

WONDERS OF THE SKY Grades 2-5

Does the sun really "set"? Who guards the North Star? These questions and more will be answered as students journey to the night sky and beyond in the planetarium. Return to Earth to make a star locator.

PLANET PEEK Pre-1

Maximum thirty-five students per session View the familiar North Polar constellations (Ursa Major and Ursa Minor, plus a seasonal constellation (Orion the Hunter, Leo the Lion or Scorpius the Scorpion). Learn about the planets through story, slides and a planet "show".

GREEK MYTHOLOGY Grades K-5

Greek mythology is as rich as the culture that engendered it. This is an excellent tool in teaching Greek mythology. Learn about Andromeda a Princess of Ethiopia, daughter of Cepheus and Cassiopea and much more.

NATIVE AMERICAN MYTHOLOGY Grades K-5

What is the difference between Greek mythology and other cultures? Explore the origins and the importance of Native American mythology stories.

NIGHT SKY

Grades K-5

What will you see in the sky tonight? Discover constellations and the motion of the night sky. Children can identify major constellations, and view the changing sky through the night.





BLUEDORN SCIENCE IMAGINARIUM

DEMONSTRATIONS

Maximum thirty students per session

SHELLS, SCALES & SPINES All ages

This interactive demonstration showcases cold-blooded reptiles, including several live specimens from the Imaginarium's menagerie. Touch, see and feel the different types of reptile and discover what makes each unique. Concepts: basic facts and animal classification and behaviors.

SUPER COLD Grades 3 & up

Using liquid nitrogen, learn how temperature is related to the three phases of matter: solids, liquids and gases. The mind shattering experiments that students will see during this demonstration will blow them away! Concepts: Phase changes, temperature, and contraction/expansion.

WILD WEATHER Grades K & up

Learn the science behind wild weather. Watch evaporation and condensation, lightning, and tornado demonstrations. Concepts: Weather and weather patterns, air pressure, water cycle, force and motion.

SNAKES ALIVE!

Grades 1 & up

This demonstration teaches basic interesting facts about snakes, and is a good way to supplement a reptiles unit! Concepts: Basic facts and animal behaviors.

KITCHEN SCIENCE Grades K-6

Get students excited about science as they observe and participate in experiments using materials found in everyday life. Concepts: Fire, air pressure, acids/bases and chemical reactions.

COMBUSTION

Grades 1 & up

Fire is a chemical reaction that scientists call combustion! Be amazed by this explosive demonstration while watching amazing effects like flash powder, flash paper and exploding hydrogen balloons. Fire safety is stressed throughout. Concepts: Fire, oxygen, temperature, fuel and explosions/concussions.

CREEPY CRAWLIES All ages

Find out why hissing cockroaches hiss, count the legs on a millipede, see how furry a giant tarantula really is and feel a snake's scales. This demonstration is guaranteed to fascinate and creep-out even your boldest students! Concepts: Basic facts and animal behaviors.

UNDER PRESSURE Grades K & up

Witness the amazing power of air! Students will be astounded as they participate in a variety of exciting experiments all about air pressure. Concepts: Air pressure, expansion/ contraction, Bernoulli effect, effects of pressure, force and motion.

NEWTON'S PLAYGROUND Grades 2 & up

Crash, Boom, Bang! Explore Newton's laws of motion in this exciting and engaging demonstration. Students will love these entertaining experiments, which demonstrate how objects move and behave in the universe. Concepts: Laws of motion, inertia, weight, gravity, mass and energy.



K'NEX

Grades 3 & up

Explore the world of simple machines by building, modifying, and experimenting with the three classes of levers. This class emphasizes teamwork, critical thinking, force, motion, and problem solving skills.

DINOSAURS AND FOSSILS Grades 2-5

The study of dinosaurs stretches our imaginations and invites us to discover a world and time much different from our own. Learn how paleontologists are able to classify the different types of fossils and what those fossils can tell us about the types of life that were present in the distant past.

MARVELOUS MINERALS Grades 3-6

Learn about the unique and interesting properties of rocks and minerals. Through hands-on participation, students will learn to classify and identify several different minerals and rocks using scientific tests. Moh's Scale of Hardness is applied.

MAGNETS Grades Pre-2

Satisfy your curiosity for the seemingly magical properties of magnets. This class introduces the basic concepts of magnets such as which materials are magnetic and which are not, the bi-polar nature of magnets, and the concepts of attraction/ repulsion to young learners.



The Imaginarium's three floors house over 75 hands-on learning science exhibits. Children can fly a hot air balloon, ride an angular momentum machine, host their own weather forecast on television, watch a tornado form and much more. Exhibits range from the physical sciences to chemistry, electricity, color and light, weather and live animal displays.

EXPLORE!

All ages



CHEMICAL CLOCK REACTION Grades 3 & up

Discover the amazing feats that can be accomplished with the science of chemistry. This class uses household materials to form chemical clock reactions. Students will measure and mix solutions in this highly hands-on experience.



BUBBLES

Grades Pre-3 Learn about the concepts of surface tension and friction through experimentation and the creation of bubbles.





IOWA VETERANS MUSEUM

SBIVM GUIDED OR SELF-GUIDED Grades 2 & up

Tour both levels of the Sullivan Brothers Iowa Veterans Museum. Choose between a guided tour by the museum staff or a self guided tour. Tour includes information about service men and women and artifacts from the Civil War to the present.

CIVIL WAR Grades 1 & up

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Tour the Civil War exhibit. Learn more about the reasons why this war started, soldiers' lives during the Civil War, and important people in the United States during this time period. This tour will also include information about Abraham Lincoln and slavery.

SULLIVAN BROTHERS/WWII Grades 2 & up

Learn more about Waterloo's Sullivan brothers and their fascinating story through a short video and a tour through their exhibit. Also learn more about World War II: who was involved, where it took place and the reasons behind the start of the war.

CURRENT CONFLICTS Grades 1 & up

This tour focuses on today's United States troops: the different branches of the military, life as servicemen and women and locations overseas where troops are stationed. Students will also tour the Current Conflict exhibit.

Maximum thirty students per session

VICTORIAN ERA CHILDREN Pre & up

What would it have been like to grow up during the Victorian Era? Was there a difference if you were rich or poor? Tour the Rensselaer Russell House Museum while focusing on the lives of the children. Includes daily life, chores, toys and games children played.

MIND YOUR MANNERS Grades 2 & up

Were children in Victorian America really "seen and not heard"? What manners were children expected to master before they could join their parents at the dinner table? This tour discovers how American children's lives have changed since the 1880's.



VICTORIAN ELEGANCE Grades 1 & up

Discover the way of life for a Victorian family living in Waterloo in the 1890s. Students will see clothing, furnishings and utensils during their tour of the Rensselaer Russell House Museum, a grand Italianate style home.

BLUEDORN SCIENCE IMAGINARIUM

A "playground' for the imagination," this interactive science center provides fun hands-on exhibits that demonstrate how science affects everyday life. Visitors may also enjoy science demonstrations.



GROUT MUSEUM OF HISTORY & SCIENCE

The Grout Museum of History & Science's history collection focuses on the period from 1833, when Iowa was opened for settlement, to the present. The Maytag Car, 1915 Waterloo Boy, Rath Packing Company whistle and Pioneer Hall Mural help visitors envision and understand bygone eras.



RENSSELAER RUSSELL HOUSE MUSEUM

Completed in 1861, this lovely brick structure is one of the oldest homes in Black Hawk County. Guided tours allow visitors to step into an authentic Victorian interior, including original family belongings and wander through picturesque Victorian gardens.



SULLIVAN BROTHERS IOWA VETERANS MUSEUM

The Sullivan Brothers Iowa Veterans Museum honors all Iowans who served the nation from the Civil War to the present. The collection, preservation and interpretation of their stories and artifacts are the core mission of the museum.
